Freddie Alaniz was caught Monday in Cancun, Mexico. He's been transported to San Antonio.

DPS records show Alaniz in February 2006 was arrested in Zavala County on a charge of sexual assault of a child, then released on bail.

Alaniz later that month was arrested in San Antonio and charged with aggravated assault for allegedly stabbing a man during a fight. He was again freed on bail. The victim later died.

Zavala and Bexar (bayr) counties in 2006 issued warrants for Alaniz.

He was added to the Texas 10 Most Wanted list in 2014.

February, 17, 2018 - at approximately 11:26 p.m., I, Officer Francisco Delapaz was patrolling West La Salle St. and had been previously notified that subject identified as Eduardo Melendrez who has an active warrant resides on said street. I then noticed subject Melendrez come

from the rear of a residence and into the side door. I then made my way to the residence and knocked on the door. Melendrez answered the door and he was advised that he has an active warrant out of the State of Minnesota. Melendrez was arrested for probation violation and

was then transported to the Zavala County Jail for booking.

Deputy Oscar Villalobos made contact with Jimenez at the Zavala County Sheriff's Department. ELECTION UPDATE

The City of Crystal City's General Election was scheduled for May 5, 2018. The terms of Councilwoman Michele R. Ruiz and Mayor Pro-Tem Joel Barajas will be expiring, both of which have filed for re-election unopposed. Therefore, the General Election will be canceled and the procedure to cancel will be followed using the Election Code guidelines for canceling an election. The City will be holding a Special Election for the Municipal Sales Tax. This tax has been in place in the past and is now up for approval once more by the voting citizens of Crystal City. This tax is $\frac{1}{4}$ cent sales tax that can only be used to reconstruct and/or repair any existing streets within the City. This has been very useful in helping us to repair streets. However, we still have much more needed work on our streets.

Early Voting by Personal Appearance begins on April 23, 2018 and ends on May 1, 2018. Early Voting by Personal Appearance is taking place in the Crystal City Memorial Library located at 101 E. Dimmit Street between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. As mandated by House Bill 2309, 79th Legislative Session, we are required to choose two (2) weekdays to be open for 12 hours during the regular early voting period. The Council has chosen these days to be Friday, April 27, 2018 and Tuesday, May 01, 2018 as the two (2) 12 hour days. The polling place for early voting will be open these two (2) days from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

CITY WIDE BRUSH PICK UP

We want to encourage everyone to clean their yards and carry all trash and branches to the landfill. The City will not be picking up any Construction/Demolition materials, household appliances, etc.; it is the responsibility of the property owner to dispose of these items properly.

The City of Crystal City will sponsor a city wide brush pick up during the months of March and October 2018. This clean-up will follow regulations set forth in the City of Crystal City Ordinance Code Section 42-7 (b) recent-

ly amended by City Council on January 16, 2018 in a duly posted regular session.

We would like to remind the public that the city provides a free day every 1st Saturday of each month, weather permitting and we encourage the public to take advantage of this free day.

Items shall be placed at property line curb, preferably where household garbage is collected;

Limbs and branches must be cut into lengths and tied into bundles not larger than 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet in height, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ feet in width, and four feet in length; and

Stone, broken concrete and debris from construction demolition or lot clearing will not be picked up.

This clean-up will be for brush ONLY.

City crews will NOT pick up mixed loads of brush and household garbage. This service is provided only once to each household. Any other brush or household garbage that is set on curb will be the responsibility of the homeowner.

Do not place items such as tires or car batteries on curb as these items will not be picked up. Failure to comply is a violation of City Code and may result in a warning or citation by City Code Enforcement Officer.

CODE ENFORCEMENT DEPARTMENT

Sec. 22-21. - Stagnant water.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person who shall own or occupy any lot in the city to permit or allow holes or places on such lot where water may accumulate and become stagnant, or to permit the same to remain.

(b) It shall be unlawful for any person who shall own or occupy any lot in the city to permit or allow the accumulation of stagnant water thereon, or to permit the same to remain.

This section also refers to certain appliances not connected to the sewer line and water being drained into the property. As above noted, this is a violation of the City Code.

Sec. 22-23. - Trash, rubbish, etc. It shall be unlawful for any person owning, claiming, occupying or having supervision or control of any real property, occupied or unoccupied, within the corporate limits of the city to permit trash, rubbish,

discarded furniture, household appliances or any other objectionable, unsightly or unsanitary matter to accumulate thereon. It shall be the duty of such person to keep such property free and *clear* of the matter referred to in this section. The removal of all trash, rubbish, discarded furniture, household appliances or objectionable, unsightly and unsanitary matter within 150 feet of any property line shall be deemed a compliance with this article.

Sec. 22-24. - Weeds, brush and grass.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person owning, claiming, occupying or having supervision or control of any real property, occupied or unoccupied, within the corporate limits of the city to allow weeds, brush or grass to grow to a height greater than ten inches above grade upon such premises, including the front or side parkway between the property line or sidewalk, if any, and the curb, if any, and the rear or side parkway between the property line and the alley pavement, if any, or traveled way.

Sec. 22-25. - Performance of work by city upon owner's or occupant's failure to comply with notice; collection of costs.

(a) If the code enforcement officer or other authorized officer or agent of the city charged with the enforcement of the provisions of this article and the abatement of the nuisance described in this article shall deem it necessary, in the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare, that the trash, rubbish, discarded furniture, household appliances or objectionable, unsightly and unsanitary matter be removed from premises which the owner or person in control thereof has been notified to *clear* pursuant to section 22-26 or the weeds, brush or

grass cut and removed from such premises, such work shall be done by the city and the actual cost thereof levied, assessed and collected against the property.

(b) Any premises upon which weeds, brush or grass are permitted to grow or accumulate to a height greater than ten inches are deemed to constitute a nuisance as a fire hazard and as dangerous to the public health, safety and welfare.

(c) It shall be unlawful for any owner or person in control of any such premises within the city to leave such weeds, brush or grass on such premises after they have been cut and it shall be the duty of the owner or person in control of any such premises within the city to remove the same.

(d) The cutting and removing of such weeds, brush or grass, at least once in every 30 days, and the cutting and removal of all weeds, brush and grass within 150 feet of any property line shall be deemed a compliance with this article.

Sec. 22-26. - Notice to owner, occupant to abate nuisance; failure to comply constitutes evidence of violation.

(a) It shall be the duty of the code enforcement officer or other authorized officer or agent of the city to notify the owner or person in control of any premises within the city on which trash, rubbish, discarded furniture, household appliances or objectionable, unsightly and unsanitary matter has accumulated or

upon which weeds, brush and grass have grown to a height greater than ten inches, to abate such nuisance within ten days of such notice.

(b) The notice shall be in writing and may be served on the owner or person in control of the premises by delivery in person, by U.S. certified mail, return receipt requested, addressed to such owner or person in control at his post office address, or, if the owner or person in control cannot be found and the certified letter is returned by the U.S. Postal Service, then notice shall be by publication two times within ten consecutive days in the official newspaper of the city. Failure of the owner or person in control of such premises to abate the nuisance within the ten-day time period after any such notice will constitute prima facie evidence of a violation of this article.

Sec. 22-27. - Performance of work by city upon owner's or occupant's failure to comply with notice; collection of costs.

(a) If the code enforcement officer or other authorized officer or agent of the city charged with the enforcement of the provisions of this article and the abatement of the nuisance described in this article shall deem it necessary, in the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare, that the trash, rubbish, discarded furniture, household appliances or objectionable, unsightly and unsanitary matter be removed from premises which the owner or person in control thereof has been notified to *clear* pursuant to section 22-26 or the weeds, brush or

grass cut and removed from such premises, such work shall be done by the city and the actual cost thereof levied, assessed and collected against the property.

(b) If the owner or person in control of such premises shall fail to pay such cost so levied and assessed within 30 days after being notified thereof, the code enforcement officer shall file with the clerk a statement of such cost signed by the mayor, and such statement shall constitute a privileged lien upon the premises, second only to tax liens and liens for street improvements, to secure the expenditures so made and such lien shall bear ten percent interest per annum on the amount from the date payment is due.



News from your County Agent

Our area continues its transformation from winter to spring fairly quickly. And what a winter this has been snow in December was the highlight of this past winter, which is rare for our area. Grasses are starting to green up, some wildflowers are starting to bloom, trees have some new foliage and folks are out and about getting the garden ready for spring planting. Several folks have called asking if it is safe to put out frost sensitive plants and the answer is yes. We are expected to have a cool down again by the latter part of the week however temperatures are

expected to only get down only to the mid to upper 40's, plenty safe for all cold sensitive plants. Greetings to all of you and thank you for reading this week.

Cotton Ginning Cost Share Program Announced by USDA

The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) has approved a cotton ginning cost share program that offsets a portion of a cotton producer's 2016 crop season ginning costs. The Cotton Ginning Cost Share (CGCS) program, announced by USDA, will provide direct marketing assistance to

producers. This program, based on the 2016 cotton crop, will help to fill the safety net void until the seed cotton ARC/PLC program is implemented beginning with the 2018 crop year.

Payments will be calculated based on a producer's 2016 cotton acres reported to the Farm Service Agency. Regional per-acre payment rates are set at 20 percent of USDA's regional costs of ginning and are set at \$30.39 for the Southwest which includes Kansas, Oklahoma and Texas. Cost share payments are capped at \$40,000 per individual or entity. Cost share program

payments do not count against the 2014 Farm Bill payment limitations.

To be eligible for a cost share program payment, each applicant is required to be a person or legal entity who was actively engaged in farming in 2016 and who complies with requirements including, but not limited to, those pertaining to highly erodible land conservation and wetland conservation provisions, commonly referred to as the conservation compliance provisions. A producer's three-year average adjusted gross income may not exceed \$900,000 to be eligible for the cost share payments. The program sign-up period is March 12, 2018 to May 11, 2018. More information about the CGCS program can be obtained by contacting the local FSA office or visiting www.fsa.usda.gov/cgcs.

Steer Tag Orders Begin Next Month

It is hard to believe we are already thinking about ordering tags and UINs for next year. Tag/UIN ordering will begin April 1, 2018. Steer Validation: Market Steer validation tag ordering process will be held online Only ONE order per county will be accepted and should be submitted by the County Validation Chairperson. Validation fee for Steers \$15 per head if ordered from April 1-April 20. Tags will go up to \$25 per head for orders placed from April 21-June 23. Payment will be due at the time of invoicing, not ordering.

The website will generate

email invoices that will be sent on April 24 for orders placed on or before the deadline. Late orders will be invoiced June 26. There will be more information regarding the steer tag ordering process.

Tip of The Week: Pruning and Trimming Freeze Damaged Plants

Several folks have called to ask how to go about pruning and trimming part of plants that seem to have been damaged from the snow and freezing conditions we had this winter.

First you need to make a very good inspection of your fruit trees and other plants that seem to show freeze damage. If you have summer bedding plants that have been severely damaged or killed such as impatiens, wax begonias, pentas, blue daze, scaevola, periwinkle and coleus. Although it's nice when they make it through the winter and provide another year of flowers, we must remember these plants are not intended to be permanent. Check for signs of life at the base of these plants. If you still see some green, cut the plants back to the living parts to stimulate regrowth. Once you do this check and see how they respond. If you do not have green at the base of these plants the time has come for you to replace them in your flower bed.

Do not prune anything for several days after a freeze so I hope that you have been putting off any pruning activities up to now. It often takes several days for all of the damage to be evident. You may even find that some plants that look damaged immediately after a freeze actually aren't. I left a pot of Easter lilies in active growth out to see if the cold would hurt them. (It got down to 28 degrees in my area.) After the freeze, the foliage looked dark and water soaked, and I was afraid they had frozen back. By the next day, though, the foliage was bright green and healthy.

The website will generate

herbaceous or non-woody plants, such as cannas, elephant ears, birds-of-paradise, begonias, impatiens, philodendrons and gingers, may be pruned back to living tissue. This pruning is optional, and is done more to neaten things up than to benefit the plants. However, if the damaged tissue is oozy, mushy, slimy and foul smelling, it should be removed.

Many folks around this area have banana trees as well so this is what you need to do. Remove the damaged foliage from banana trees but do not cut back the trunk unless you can tell for sure that it has been killed. It will look brown, feel mushy, feel loose in the soil and will bleed a lot if punctured. The exception would be any banana trees that produced a bunch of fruit last year. They will not send up any more new growth, and should be cut to the ground to make room for new shoots that will come up this summer.

Dead leaves on woody tropical plants, such as hibiscus, tibouchina, angel trumpet, croton, ixora, schefflera, copper plant and rubber tree, can be picked off to make things look neater. If you can clearly determine what branches are dead on a woody plant, you can prune them back.

Try scratching the bark with your thumbnail. If the tissue underneath is green, it's still alive. If the tissue is tan or brown, the branch is dead. Start at the top and work your way down to see how far back the plant was killed. Generally, it's a good idea to delay hard pruning of woody plants until new growth begins in the spring and you can more accurately determine which parts are alive and what is dead. Remember, don't be too quick to dig up tropical plants that have been severely damaged. They may eventually re-sprout from the base of the plant or the roots in April or May.





Jesus was talking about the Cross and His victory over Satan and Death. Numbers 21:6-9's message is to look at the Cross with faith and we shall live.

In a few words I have said seven things that Cross did for us. **#1-Jesus died on the Cross in our place; #2-Righteousness is imputed to us, the righteousness of Christ; #3-God keeps His promises and are Yes & Amen in Christ made possible by the Cross; #4-Salvation in Christ is yes; #5-the promise of the Holy Spirit which makes us sons of God; #6-faith in the Cross of Christ is our victory; #7-Yes, there is forgiveness in the Cross of Jesus.**

TxDOT urges drivers to plan for a sober ride during Spring Break

AUSTIN, Texas--(BUSINESS WIRE)--Mar 1, 2018--Each year in Texas, more than half of drivers involved in deadly drunk driving crashes are between the ages of 17 and 34. With many college students and young adults heading to Spring Break destinations in the coming weeks, the Texas Department of Transportation's "Plan While You Can" campaign reminds them to make a sober ride part of their festivities.

The "Plan While You Can" campaign includes a statewide tour featuring an interactive dodgeball game where participants try to avoid incoming "beach balls" as virtual drinks are added to the screen. As more drinks are added, participants experience how drinking can slow their reaction times as on-screen avatars begin responding more slowly to their players' movements. The experience will visit eight Texas cities during March.

While drivers under the influence of alcohol risk killing or seriously injuring themselves or others, they also face up to \$17,000 in fines and fees, jail time and loss of their driver's license. Visit SoberRides.org to find alternatives to drinking and driving, such as:

Designating a sober driver, or calling someone for a sober ride home. Contacting a cab or ride-share service. Using mass transit. Spending the night.

ORDINANCE NO. 18-03

A ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CRYSTAL CITY, TEXAS REPEALING THE SECTION OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES WHICH PROVIDES THAT N. 11TH AVENUE, BETWEEN FM 1433 AND E. HOLLAND ST., IS A ONE WAY STREET AND RETURNING SAID PORTION OF SAID STREET TO A TWO-WAY STREET; PROVIDING FOR THE REMOVAL OF POSTED SIGNS DESIGNATING SUCH PORTION SAID STREET AS ONE-WAY; AND PROVIDING THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT AND BE IN FORCE FROM AND AFTER ITS DESCRIPTIVE CAPTION HAS BEEN PUBLISHED TWICE IN THE LOCAL NEWSPAPER.

WHEREAS, The Transportation Code authorize a municipality, as a local authority, to designated a public street located therein as a two-way

street and required each vehicle on such street to move in a specific direction.

WHEREAS, The Transportation code provides that no ordinance which designates a street to change from a one-way to a two-way shall be effective until signs giving notice thereof are posted on or at the entrance to affected street as may be most appropriate; and,

WHEREAS, The City Council of the City of Crystal City, Texas Has determined and does here now declare that such one-way street designation is no longer necessary to the health, safety and general welfare of the inhabitants of the city.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of Crystal City: is hereby repealing the section of the Code of Ordinance and that the status of N. 11th Avenue, between FM 1433 and E. Holland St. is hereby restored to a two-way traffic street and that the City Manager of the City of Crystal City, is hereby authorized and directed to cause the signs on N. 11th Avenue giving notice of its status as a one-way traffic only status be removed. No offense committed and no fine, forfeiture or penalty incurred prior to the effective date of this ordinance shall be affected by the adoption of this ordinance but the punishment for any offense committed and the recovery of any fines or forfeitures incurred prior to such date shall take place as if this ordinance has not been adopted. If any section or provision of this ordinance is found to be unconstitutional, void or inoperative by the final judgment of a court of competent jurisdiction, such defective provision, if any, is hereby declared to be severable from the remaining sections and provisions of this ordinance and such remaining sections and provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its descriptive caption has been published twice in the local newspaper.
