## Sentencing delayed for Jonas

DEL RIO - U.S. District Judge Alia Moses postponed a planned sentencing Wednesday for former lobbyist James Jonas III, who faces a long prison term for crimes he committed while he was the attorney and city manager for Crystal City.

Moses gave Jonas permission at his reset hearing on May 16 to call three witnesses he claims were coerced to perjure themselves at his trial last year.

She also appointed a lawyer to assist him, something he had earlier rejected.

"The prosecutor manipulated statements and forced witnesses to lie," Jonas declared, and named San Antonio lawyer Jane Macon, Austin civil engineer Dan Hejl and San Antonio City Councilman Manny Pelaez as those witnesses.

Pelaez testified at trial that Jonas had tried to enlist him in a kickback scheme involving a solar energy company seeking to do business in Crystal City. Instead, he said, he went straight to the FBI.

Pelaez, who was in the

courtroom Wednesday, denied Jonas' accusation.

"It's his constitutional right to make any argument he wants to, no matter how meritless," he said.

Jonas was among five Crystal City officials charged in 2016 after a three-year federal anti-corruption investigation. A North Texas businessman who operated an eight-liner parlor there was also charged.

Jonas and the others were accused of taking bribes and kickbacks from people seeking to do business with the city, as well as other crimes.

Last summer, after a week-long trial, he was convicted of all 18 counts in the indictment. Former Crystal City Mayor Ricardo Lopez, his co-defendant, was also convicted.

Lopez awaits sentencing, along with the other four defendants, all of whom pleaded guilty. Jonas, 56, has been incarcerated since he was found guilty.

The once dapper and well-groomed lobbyist was hardly recognizable Wednesday when he shuffled into the courtroom. He appeared gaunt and aged, having lost a lot of weight and with hair down to his neckline. Wearing an orange jump suit, and

orange plastic slippers, he was shackled hand and foot.

In objecting to the sentencing being delayed, Assistant U.S. Attorney Bill Harris dismissed the claims of forced perjury as being

merely another "dilatory" tactic by Jonas, who has been representing himself since late last year.

"He wants to re-litigate the case. He wants to raise issues of prosecutorial misconduct

that are not appropriate at a sentencing hearing," said Harris.

Harris, one of the two trial prosecutors in Jonas's case, offered only a cryptic comment following the unexpected

outcome of the Wednesday hearing.

"While justice delayed is sometimes justice denied, we are confident justice will be served," he said.

## Small Business “What You Meed to Know”

Last week I asked everyone to be aware and celebrate Small Business Week, (April 29-May 5). Why? Small Business is the backbone of our American economy.

Let's answer some questions about how Small Businesses affect our lives:

### How many small businesses are there in Texas?

According to the *Small Business Administration Office of Advocacy, 2018 Small Business Profile*, Texas has 2.6 million small businesses which relates to 98% of all business in the State. (Firms with fewer than 100 employees have the

largest share of small business employment)

How many jobs do they create, Texas, Region?

- Texas - 46% of employees work for a small business.
- Zavala County - 32%
- Dimmit County - 30%
- Uvalde County - 58%
- Industries:
- Agriculture - 83%
- Oil & Gas - 40%
- Real Estate - 61%
- Construction - 68%
- Food Service - 56%

### How many Women and Minority-Owned businesses operate in Texas?

1.1 million States are ranked by the

number of enterprises operated, Texas is #3 in the nation for Women-Owned businesses. “All Minority-Owned Business” in Texas relates to more than 33% of total businesses in the State.

As Prairie View A&M University, Community & Economic Development Extension Agent, I work with limited resource individuals to assist with planning, beginning, expanding and financing small businesses by consulting one-on-one with the entrepreneur(s) or providing classes in the “Business in Development, “BID Program” sponsored by the University at no cost to the participant. One area of the program addresses “*Doing Business with the more than 200 State Agencies, Universities/Colleges, Regional and Local Communities*”. I guide business owners through the certification process with the Texas State Comptroller’s Office of Purchasing to become a “Historically Under-Utilized Business” or HUB. ## U.S. Senate Rep. Beto O’Rourke to visit Dimmit County for a Town Hall

El Paso Congressman Beto O’Rourke will continue his campaign for the U.S. Senate with his first visit to Dimmit County next Thursday. He will host a town hall in Carrizo Springs. Since launching his campaign more than a year ago, O’Rourke has traveled the state and visited more than 245 counties to hold open dialogues with Democrats, Republicans, independents and non-voters alike. “Running this campaign with people instead of PACs or special interests allows us to visit Carrizo Springs for a

town hall so we can continue listening and learning from those we want to serve and represent,” said O’Rourke. “Whether it’s talking about how we make sure every one of us can see a doctor, how we protect Medicare and Social Security or how we get Texans working in good paying jobs, I leave these town halls with a better understanding of the big, bold, important issues our state wants to lead on.”

Following his visit to Dimmit County, O’Rourke will hold a town hall in Uvalde. Prior to these public meetings, he held events in Edinburg, Laredo, McAllen, Brownsville, San Angelo, Ozona, Eldorado, Sonora, Rocksprings, Leakey, Houston, San Antonio and Austin.

Next week’s town hall follows O’Rourke’s announcement that his grassroots campaign raised more than \$6.8 million in the first three months of 2018 without taking a dime from Political Action Committees or special interests. This was two times more than what Ted Cruz raised in the same time. While bringing in more than 141,000 contributions in the first quarter, the El Pasoan has now outtraised Cruz in four of the campaign’s five FEC reporting periods.

A new Quinnipiac poll released earlier this month also found the Texas Senate race “too close to call.” The new survey showed O’Rourke within only three points of Ted Cruz, who leads 47-44.

### Tax Amnesty program begins May 1

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar today reminded Texans about the temporary tax amnesty program giving certain delinquent taxpayers a chance to make their accounts compliant with state tax law without incurring penalties and interest on tax due.

The Texas Tax Amnesty Program will run from May 1 to June 29, 2018. The program applies to periods prior to Jan. 1, 2018, and only includes liabilities that have not been previously reported to the Comptroller.

Passed by the Texas Legislature in 2017, Senate Bill 1 requires the Comptroller of

Public Accounts to establish a tax amnesty program to encourage voluntary reporting by: delinquent taxpayers who do not have a Texas Sales and Use Tax Permit, or are not registered for a tax or fee administered by the Comptroller’s office; and taxpayers who have a permit, but may have underreported or owe additional taxes or fees.

The Texas Tax Amnesty Program does not apply to periods currently under audit review, IFTA taxes, PUC Gross Receipts assessments, Local Motor Vehicle Tax and Unclaimed Property payments.

Two major wildfires in Oklahoma have been contained after killing two people and at least 1,500 cattle while burning almost 350,000 acres. Now producers are trying to pick up the pieces and there are ways to help. (Oklahoma State University) After burning for two weeks the Rhea and 34 Complex wildfires have been contained allowing producers to assess damage and start to recovery efforts. Wildfire containment for the Oklahoma wildfires was aided by much needed rainfall which fell across the affected area last week.

The moisture was more than what the region had seen in the past six months. Oklahoma Forestry Services say there are still hot spots within the containment zones of each fire where some cedar trees and other brush are still burning. Containment just means a fire line has been established around the perimeter of the fires, but the spread

of the fires should be halted.

Local Oklahoma Cooperative Extension Service agents are helping facilitate donations of hay, feed, milk replacer and fencing supplies. ## Tip of the Week: Do You Have Nematodes in the Garden? -What To Do About Them

If you have a good fertility program, sound water applications, good weed control but your garden is still wimpy perhaps it is nematodes. Nematodes—especially root-knot nematodes—cause major losses in vegetable home gardens in Texas. Root-knot nematodes are microscopic roundworms that can pierce the roots of certain plant species and lay their eggs inside the roots. This gives the roots a "knotty" appearance and results in a wilted or stunted appearance of the whole plant.

Thanks to cool weather so far in the Zavala County area nematode damage might not be showing up at this time however as we go deeper into late spring and early summer and soil temperatures remain

constant at 70-85 degrees these temperatures are more suitable for nematode activity and thus you will begin to see symptoms in your vegetable garden. Root-knot nematodes can knock back yields and quality on pumpkins, tomatoes, sweet potatoes, beets, cucumbers, carrots, peaches, watermelons, and okra. Even ornamental plants such as roses that have been started from rootstock can be hammered by the pest. Plants growing in nematode-infested soils usually are unthrifty, stunted, yellowish, and have galled and decayed roots. Plants with infected roots are more susceptible to other diseases caused by fungi and bacteria and tend to stop producing early.

Root-knot nematode problems can be detected by examining the roots of vegetables for the conspicuous root galls (swellings) as soon as harvest is completed or through a soil assay. Once the nematodes are inside the roots, effective treatments are not available, therefore you need to begin early if you suspect nematodes in the garden.

So what can you do? Crop rotation is one of the oldest and most economical methods of controlling nematodes. Rotation is simply the practice of not growing a susceptible host in the same site for more than one year. Typically, planting a highly susceptible crop a few feet from where it was grown the previous year will avoid damage by nematodes.

Also, if space is available, the entire garden site may be moved to a new location after one or two years. When the garden site is moved, it is helpful to select a site that has been in grass for several years. Non-host plants that are especially suitable for rotation with vegetables include fescue, small grains, and marigolds.

Home gardeners should seriously consider succession planting (multiple cropping) in the rotational scheme. For example, if a short-season vegetable that is susceptible to root-knot is grown in one area of the garden, a fall crop (such as a resistant variety of tomato) often can be produced in the same soil without any yield loss. It is frequently easier to plan a rotational program by dividing the garden site into thirds.

With this scheme, it is easier to consider all factors that affect plant growth such as shade, fertilization, water, and time of harvest.

Another method of control is to use nematode resistant vegetable varieties. Several vegetable varieties are resistant to root-knot nematodes and will produce a good crop even in the presence of nematodes. The effectiveness is increased when combined with crop rotation. By alternating root-knot resistant and susceptible vegetables within a given portion of the garden from one year to the next, the overall nematode problem can be reduced by preventing a build-up of high populations. This practice will reduce the risk of serious damage to the susceptible vegetables.

Many of these varieties, especially the tomatoes, can be purchased at local lawn and garden centers or can be purchased through online retailers. Others are more difficult to obtain and may have to be ordered directly from the producer.

Zavala county hot summer temperatures can help you control nematode problems. The population of root-knot nematodes can be reduced significantly in one season by repeated tilling (every

10 days) of the garden soil during the hot, dry summer, to bring the nematodes to the surface to be killed by the drying of the sun.

The fallow section must be kept free of weeds and old roots to be effective. Covering the fallow section between tilling with black plastic may help. Remove All Plants Immediately After Harvest: Destroy plants and plant roots by pulling up immediately after harvest. Do not let stalks stand through the winter. Work the soil two to four times in winter, allowing the sun and weather to exert their killing effect. Vapam was the most effective nematicide available. Notice I wrote was, because unfortunately, the chemical control for nematodes named Vapam is no longer available. There are no chemical nematicides labeled for use on annual bedding or vegetable plants that have been effective.

The bionematicide MeloCon WG contains a fungus that parasitizes nematode eggs. MeloCon can suppress but not eliminate root-knot and sting nematodes. Therefore your best bet is to use the cultural practices I have mentioned in this column. Have a great nematode free week and summer.

City of Crystal City voters will consider the City's Street Maintenance Sales Tax in a special election this May 2018. Polls open at 7 a.m. and close at 7 p.m. on Election Day, which is May 5, 2018.

**Crystal City current sales tax is 8.00%. How that breaks down:**

- City tax of 1.00%
- 4B EDC tax of 0.50%
- 4A EDC tax of 0.25%
- State tax of 6.25%

If voters approve the referendum, Crystal City's sales tax rate will be 8.25%. The maximum allowed by state law is 8.25%.

**What is sales tax charged on?**

< Apparel < Electronics < Furniture < Entertainment < Tangible property and services

**Sales tax is NOT charged on:**

< Groceries < Prescriptions < Property consumed in manufacturing and processing

< Non-residents who purchase goods in Crystal City would share the cost of street maintenance through sales tax.

# A 1/4 cent sales tax equals about 5 cents on a \$20 taxable purchase.

**When will the tax rate become effective?**

If voters approve the increase in the May 2018 election and the Comptroller's Office receives election results by the end of June, the tax will take effect on October 1, 2018. The city will begin receiving revenue from the Comptroller with its December 2018 sales tax allocation.

This tax is a combined rate of all sales and use tax that does not exceed 2 percent at any location in the City. City of Crystal City Public Works Department uses revenue generated by the quarter-cent Street Maintenance Sales Tax to provide ongoing repairs to concrete and asphalt streets throughout the city. The sales tax allows the City to patch hundreds of potholes, seal cracks, resurface roadways and replace small sections of broken concrete streets to prevent further deterioration. These maintenance and rehabilitation efforts extend the lifespan of our vast street network.

In 2001, a new state law allowed the city and its voters to approve a 1/4 cent sales tax to be used exclusively for repairing existing streets and alleys. The City of Crystal City has had this tax ongoing since 2006 when it was passed by voters at an election held in May 2006. The tax expires every 4 years and it is brought back to the voters of Crystal City for re-authorization. However, past administration did not place the reauthorization of this tax on the 2014 May Election so the tax expired and that is why it is now on the May 2018 ballot for authorization by the voters.

#### Quando se hara efectiva la tasa tributaria?

Si los votantes aprueban el aumento en la eleccion de Mayo 2018 y la Contraloria de la oficina estatal recibe los resultados de las elecciones para fin de junio, el impuesto tomara efecto el 1 de Octubre, 2018. La ciudad comensara a recibir ingresos de la Contraloria estatal con su asignacion de impuestos de ventas del 2018 de Diciembre.

Este impuesto es una tasa combinada de todos los impuestos de venta y uso que no exeden el 2 por ciento en cualquier ubicacion en Crystal City.

En 2001, una nueva ley estatal permite la ciudad y sus votantes aprobar un impuesto de ventas de ventas de un por ciento exclusivamente para la reparacion de calles y callejones existentes. Los fondos recolectados no pueden gastarse mas que para el mantenimiento de las calles, segul la ley estatal.

Crystal City ha tenido este impuesto en curso desde 2006. El impuesto expira cada 4 anos y es traído de nuevo a los votantes de la ciudad de Crystal City para la reautorizacion. Sin embargo, la administracion anterior no coloco la reautorizacion de este impuesto sobre la eleccion de Mayo 2014 asi que el impuesto expiro y esa es la razon ahora porque esta en la balota de la eleccion de Mayo 2018 para la autorizacion de los votantes.

# THIS WAS THE NEWS

From the Files of the Zavala County Sentinel

**JULY 23, 1937**

Highway Patrolman R. H. Kelly had 19 people before City Magistrate J. E. Peel Wednesday evening for having no tail lights on their cars. All but one of the 19 pleaded guilty and were assessed a fine of \$5 each.

We had the pleasure Wednesday morning of visiting the farms of A. F. Cadenhead, in company with S. C. Freed and W. S. Wilmeth. We inspect a plot of lima beans, about an acre. These beans looked good and seemed peculiarly adapted to that soil. Incidentally, the Cadenheads have about 50 Ancona pullets a little less than four months old, but laying. Mr. Cadenhead was going to show us the eggs but Mrs. Cadenhead had already used them in bread or cake or ice cream. It was made us want to stay for dinner.

The discovery of oil flowing at the rate of about 100 barrels daily from an abandoned well in the Rycade Field in Maverick County, 19 miles east of Eagle Pass, has brought in a rush of lease hounds and drillers.

**AUGUST 6, 1948**

Postmaster James R. Pipes announced this week that city delivery services will be inaugurated in Crystal City on October 1, and urged all patrons who intend to have mail delivered by carrier to install mail boxes at once.

Sam Lanham of the Media REA Cooperative, is just back from Washington and reports that the application for Zavala County has been approved. This is the electrical lines east of the Loma Vista community which extends to the Nueces River and south into Dimmit County.

The high school faculty is complete for the opening of school with the exception of band-gee club. New teachers are Miss Jean Donaldson, English and speech; Miss Anna Ruth Johnson, commercial; Miss Elaine McKean, physical education; and Miss Maxine Williams, home economics.

A new arrival at the Winter Haven experimental station is Dr. O. H. Calvert who is taking over the plant pathologist's duties left vacant by Dr. S. S. Ivanoff.

Twenty-five bales of cotton have been ginned this week at La Pryor. Some farmers are now making inquiry about pickers. A. D. Walker, we understand, wants a four-bale crew.

**JULY 19, 1957**

A. R. Rutledge was appointed County Road Administrator by the Zavala County Commissioners Court on July 13. The appointment was made possible by an act which amended Section 5 of the Optional County Road Law of 1947 which eliminated the requirement by a licensed professional engineer.

The C.G. Morrison variety store chain has purchased the furniture store and fixtures and merchandise of Pullen's department store and took over operation of the store on Monday. They have also leased the building. Oscar Rice arrived last week to manage the store. He is from El Paso.

**JULY 21, 1977**

Raul T. Flores began his duties as City Manager of the City of Crystal City last Friday. Flores said that his first efforts are being directed to improving the conditions of the downtown area. Flores resigned as assistant fiscal director of the Urban Renewal Agency, a position he had held for almost 6 years.

The City of Crystal City has accepted the offer of \$1000 per month from the County of Zavala to operate an ambulance service for the community. The county will also furnish the ambulance to the city.

El Amanecer, Inc. will have the grand opening of its culture center Saturday. There will be a special art exhibit donated to the chicano people by Ates Plasticas of Mexico City.

## Texas Transportation Department to waive \$1.3B in late fines

AUSTIN, Texas (AP) — The Texas Department of Transportation will forgive more than \$1.3 billion in late fines and fees owed by drivers on state toll roads since 2007.

The department announced the decision last

week at a House Transportation Committee meeting in response to a cap on unpaid toll fees lawmakers imposed last year, the Austin American-Statesman reported.

The move only covers tolls incurred on roads op-

erated by the Transportation Department, such as State Highway 130 and State Highway 45 North. The decision doesn't affect tolls, fines or fees racked up on tollways operated by the Central Texas Regional Mobility Authority or other local toll agencies.

The new law took effect last month and limits administrative fees on state-operated tollways to \$6, with an annual maximum of \$48. The department will charge \$4 a month for unpaid tolls.

Texas didn't have such a cap before, so the department's fines could quickly amount to \$25 per unpaid toll or more when cases were referred to a collection agency or a court. Some drivers saw debts of thousands of dollars.

Department officials said they won't refund late fees and fines previously paid, including those made in the first two months of this year.


